INDEPENDENCE DAY THE 4TH OF JULY



Independence Day, which is commonly known as the Fourth of July to commemorate the adoption of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th 1776 from Great Britain. We also associate it with fireworks, parades, barbecues, carnivals, fairs, picnics, concerts, and family reunions. . It is a National Holiday of the United States.

THE DOIN'S


Northville has celebrated "the 4th" for many years. For years Northville folks have called it the DOIN'S. There was always a parade, which always included the Northville High School Band, floats, horses, fire engines, bikes, and out of town bands. In the 1940's the Northville Fireman's Association sponsored the "Doin's. In 1950 the Firemen announced that they were dropping the sponsorship because it was getting to be more than they could handle. At this time the Northville Civic Association was formed and they took over the sponsorship. They are still involved, but for the last 3 yrs they delegated the organization of the parade to Teresa Greenhill and her committee. Teresa just announced that this will be her last year to do so.

In the 1940's and early '50's the Doin's were held in the vacant lot where our fire station is now located. As the event became larger, the Doin's were moved to the property of the American Legion on North Main Street. (The post office is located there now) During this era, there was much local involvement from the churches, scouts, and other local organizations. Remember the ring toss to win a cane or wooden majorette baton? I still have one of those batons, it's now in our museum. The Doin's also took place at the school grounds and once in the Catholic Church parking lot. After the new post office was built on the American Legion property, it has been held in the Village Waterfront Park behind the Main Street businesses.

This poster was sent to me a number of years ago from a historian in Albany, NY. It may be the oldest record of the Fourth of July celebration that took place in Northville. (1859) Notice they also enjoyed fire works. They were shot off on the hill behind the Presbyterian Church.

Clergy and Physicians,
Soldiers of the War of 1812,

Thirty-three juvenile ladies will represent the States, and form in procession with the adult ladies, to whom a suitable place in the Procession will be assigned.

The Procession will then march to the Pine Grove, where an Orator will be delivered.



Doctors Considering Grafting Muscle On Injured Limb

Northville Fire Chief Glen Duncan was reported to be in good condition in Ellis Hospital, Schenectady, today after suffering torn muscles and a compound fracture of his right arm while setting off the municipal fireworks display Wednesday night.

Duncan was the second casualty of the Northville Independence Day celebration. A drum majorette, Miss Lee McDonald, 19, fainted while leading the Van Rhodes Volunteer Fire Department down Main Street during the morning parade.

Taken To Hospital

Miss McDonald was treated by Dr. Clem Gritsavage and taken to the Glens Falls Hospital by ambulance where she is reported to be improving today. She is the daughter of Mrs. George Mooso of Luzerne.

Chief Duncan was injured when a shell used in the fireworks display went off prematurely as it was being shot off at the top of Prospect Hill.

In the hospital Duncan explained the 14-inch shell is usually fired from behind a barrier. The procedure used is this:

One man brings a shell from the ammunition dump while another stands guard over the shells. The shell is handed to Duncan inside the barrier. He lights it, drops it in a receptacle filled with water, then retreats behind the barrier as it goes off.

Received Shell

Wednesday night Duncan had fired several shells when he received the faulty shell. He revealed, according to Mrs. Duncan, he lit the fuse which was described as a long one, then just before he dropped it in the water realized something was wrong with it. Duncan fell on his face as the shell exploded.

The 46-year-old fire chief has set off the displays annually for several years without a mishap.

Doctors say it may be possible to graft new muscle on the arm if no complications set in.

Today the fireworks are shot off by professionals which prevents injury to our firemen.


